Docent Information Sheet

- We hope you enjoy the new portfolio format and find it requires less prep on your part. Please do not hesitate to call or email us with questions. Thank you and have fun!
- The enclosed “Artist Bio” is for the docent’s information and use. It should not be read to the class. Please read it in advance so you will be more familiar with the information found in the presentation outline we have provided.
- The “Today in GRACE Art” handout provides a short description of the artist, their work and ways to find out more about the artist. It is a great take-home for the parents!
- The “Activities” pages provide suggested activities and materials for different grade levels. You will find a grade-level appropriate set of activities for the “Red” level (kindergarten-2nd grade), “Yellow” level (3rd-4th grade), and “Green” level (5th-6th grade). Each activity has been designed by a certified art teacher for that level, but you can feel free to adapt the projects as required by time, specific class, or available materials.
- The “Presentation Outlines” are intended to be used with the PowerPoint presentations; if you are only using the posters you will need to adapt your presentation. The outlines have been color coded for each level:
 - “Red” level (kindergarten-2nd grade)
 - “Yellow” level (3rd-4th grade)
 - “Green” level (5th-6th grade).
 - If you receive the portfolios digitally you can print the outlines by selecting File>Print> and change to “Notes Pages” under settings, then print.
 - The notes on the outlines can be seen on your monitor in PowerPoint (but not on the projected screen) by selecting “Use presenter view” under the “Slide Show” Tab once you have connected the projector to your computer.
- The “Poster Inventory” describes the included posters, which can be used to supplement the PowerPoint presentations.
