Fall 2017 Enrichment Class Descriptions (Listed Alphabetically)

Basketball (1-6): This class focuses on the fundamentals of basketball through skill-building drills and games. Basics of basketball will be introduced to those new to the game while those with past experience will expand their knowledge. We will play small sided games along with fun skill development games. It's a great way to get some exercise and learn about teamwork! *(Instruction provided by Chris Kurtzman)*

Chess Club (K-6): Chess club is taught by experienced Silver Knights Enrichment players and educators using a curriculum developed by National Masters. Each weekly session is a mix of learning and play and is open to all skill levels. Playing chess is a great way to develop a child's critical thinking skills, sportsmanship, and patience — all while having fun! *(Instruction provided by Silver Knights Enrichment)*

Coding with Fun (1-6): Today most children use computers and manipulate media, but few of them know how to create the media or software they are using. This class will teach students how to create and develop computer programs (games, stories, etc.) instead of playing them. Students will learn the computer programming concepts in a fun and interactive way. They will combine media elements to create and share their own interactive stories, animations, games, music, and art. Students will learn basic reasoning and problem-solving skills. They will have an opportunity to think creatively, communicate clearly, use technology fluently, and collaborate effectively. They will also create their own computer programs to implement computer games and combine multiple topics (math, science, teamwork). *(Instruction provided by Stemtree)*

Creative WeDo Robotics (K-2): This class welcomes newcomers to WeDo robotics as well as students who are looking for additional WeDo robotics challenges. The course emphasizes creative problem-solving challenges, design innovation, and basic applied math concepts. Using an expanded construction set, students build more complex mechanisms and robots, and use their innovation and critical thinking skills to engineer their own creative solutions to exciting challenges. Newcomers will use the basic WeDo kits and can access the expanded construction sets when they feel ready to do so. *(Instruction provided by Fairfax Collegiate)*

FHES Environmental Club (3-6): Come learn about the biodiversity of our school grounds! Students will work with club leaders to enhance our school grounds by planting, weeding, and adding in some creative touches all around the school. We will continue to work together to Fly High for a Greener World! *(Instruction provided by FHES teachers Ms. Kuykendall)*

Filmmaking (3-6): Students learn to plan, write, shoot, edit and complete post-production on a digital video short film. They will first learn about the basics of film, shot composition, scripting, storyboarding and the pre-production phases of filmmaking. Students then move on to act out scripts and shoot the film using boom mics and professional digital video cameras. Finally, students edit their raw footage to complete the post-production phase. Students will take home a DVD of their short film at the end of the class. *(Instruction taught by Fairfax Collegiate)*

Karate (K-6): This popular class is a disciplined introduction to the sport by Kaizen Karate. Your child will learn the beautiful art of karate while gaining safety and defensive skills in a respectful environment. The class will also emphasize the basic karate principles of focus, patience and self-discipline. Returning students will continue to work toward new belts while first time students will be able to start the belt program. *(Instruction provided by Kaizen Karate)*

KidArt (1-6): Always a popular class! Ms. Joyce will expose students to a plethora of mediums in this process-oriented, fine art class. Creative expression is encouraged to help build your student's artistic confidence and skill. In this multi-media program, students will experience a wide variety of projects during

the session and create works of art to treasure for years to come! *(Instruction provided by Joyce Taylor Homan)*

Kids on a Mission (4-6): New course offering! In this Junior Philanthropy program, students will take action to help others and will learn about the importance of compassion and giving. Students will participate in various projects to help them think beyond themselves while improving team building, project management, goal setting and public speaking skills. Students will participate in hands-on activities coordinated by the Touching Heart organization to help children in the greater community. *(Instruction provided by Touching Heart)*

Minecraft Club (1-3): Turn the Minecraft computer game into an educational experience with this introductory class. Students will learn how to install, run, and eventually create customized Minecraft mods. They will also set up and join a curated private server, customize graphics and gameplay, and develop their problem-solving and teamwork skills as they tackle a wide variety of challenges together with their classmates. Students of any Minecraft level can join and expect to be challenged and engaged. *(Instruction provided by Fairfax Collegiate)*

Robotics Club (3-6): This club focuses on LEGO's EV3 robotics platform. Students design, construct, and program their robots to perform in sensor-based challenges, as well as robotic competitions. Initial student projects include hill climbing, beacon retrieval, color sensor navigation, and robot combat. Advanced programming and more complex robotics tasks are available for students who are ready for additional challenges. Students with any level of robotics experience are welcome to join. *(Instruction provided by Fairfax Collegiate)*

Science Exploratorium (K-2): Science Exploratorium returns to Flint Hill this fall with all new lessons! In this popular STEAM-based class, children will discover, experiment, and create as they learn about the colliding worlds of art and science. They will create biomes from around the world, star gaze at constellations, master meteorology, investigate how things work and dabble in chemistry and physics. This STEAM class will rock their world! *(Instruction provided by Little Scholars)*

Soccer (K-2): This class focuses on the fundamentals of soccer through skill-building drills and games. Basics of soccer will be introduced to those new to soccer while those with past experience will expand their knowledge. We will play small sided games along with fun skill development games. It's a great way to get exercise while learning the skills of soccer, teamwork, and sportsmanship...all while having fun! *(Instruction provided by Chris Kurtzman)*

Sports & Games (K-2): Come join the fun! Flint Hill's youngest students can experience a variety of different team sports, games, and activities that promote an active healthy lifestyle. Children can release some energy, get some exercise, learn new sports and games, and socialize with other children. Values such as sportsmanship, teamwork, sharing, and consideration of others will be stressed. *(Instruction provided by Chris Kurtzman)*

Sports & Games Plus (3-6): We've upped the fun quotient! Flint Hill's older students will learn how to be lifelong physically active individuals through a variety of different games and activities. Emphasis will be placed on teamwork, sharing, consideration, exercise, and FUN! *(Instruction provided by Chris Kurtzman)*

Zumba Kids (K-6): Flint Hill music teacher, Ms. Grant, brings the Zumba Kids program back this fall! Zumba Kids is the ultimate dance-fitness party for youngsters where they can move to the groove with friends. This program features fitness moved set to age-appropriate, Latin-inspired music that can get kids movin' to the beat! Students will dance to the following styles: Salsa, Merengue, Bachata, Reggae, Calypso, Bollywood and Bhangra. Zumba is a fun way to get in shape! *(Course taught by FHES music teacher Ms. Grant)*

Registration Instructions

After school registration opens at 10 AM on Monday, September 11th and closes on Wednesday, September 20th at 11:45 PM. The registration process will be the same as in the past school year on www.pay4schoolstuff.com.

Prior to starting the registration process, please make sure you have updated your student's grade level on www.pay4schoolstuff.com – this isn't automatic and must be done by the parent/guardian each year.

How do I register my child(ren)?

- Each **registration/child** will require the completion of emergency contact information **each time**. *Please have ALL of the required information on hand before trying to register your student(s)*. Required information: Student's teacher, parent/guardian cell number for 2 parents, the name & phone number for one LOCAL contact person other than parent/guardian to be able to contact if you are not available, student's normal route home from school, student's dismissal from after school classes, adults authorized to pick student up from class, and any allergies/medical concerns/special needs.
- Take time to look over the class offerings and gather the emergency information for your students so that you are ready by registration time.
- Log onto your Pay4SchoolStuff account (or create a new one if you don't have one already) at www.pay4schoolstuff.com
- On the "Welcome" page, click on the orange "select" button beside the name of the student you want to register for class(es). **This step must be done PER STUDENT in order to get your student into the correct class(es)!** This will bring you to the "Item Selection" page which contains all of the options available for purchase for this student.
- Click on the orange "select" button beside "After School Registration". This will bring you to the After School Registration Form. **This form must be completed PER STUDENT before any classes can be selected!** Click on the small box to the left of "select" and the form will automatically pop up. Fill in the required emergency items, click "save."
- In next "Waiver & Rules of Conduct" box, click on the small box to the left of "select" and the form will automatically pop up. Please read the statement and input your full name to acknowledge acceptance of the waiver and rules of conduct. To access the full document, click on the uploaded document in the "custom description" box.
- Once **BOTH** of these forms are filled out, you will be able to view and select from the full range of classes available. **Please remember, you are only registering for the student selected and NOT all of your students!**
- Once you have selected all of the classes for that **ONE** student, please scroll down and click on "add to cart." You will be directed to the payment page. You can either select "continue shopping"(this option is to continue shopping for the **SAME** student), "pay for another student" (*this option should be used to register a 2nd student for classes following*

the same procedure above) or “Pay Now” (this item will complete the registration process for the **SAME** student).

How can I register another student? You can do this all in one transaction by selecting “pay for another student” on the payment page and following the procedure outlined above. Remember, you will have to go to the orange “select” button beside the name of the next student you want to register. This will direct you to the forms first and then to the classes.

The class I wanted is full, how do I put my student on a wait list?

- Go to www.pay4schoolstuff.com and log into your parent account.
- At the welcome screen, click on the orange “select” button by the name of the student that you want to add to a wait list.
- At the “item selection” screen, click on the orange “select” button by “Wait List for After School.” This will bring you to a screen that contains the various wait list options.
- Click on the “select” box in the left hand corner of the box and the form will automatically pop up.
- Fill in the required information and click on “save”
- Click on “add to cart” which will take you to the “PayNow” screen.
- **IMPORTANT STEP:** Click on “pay now” to complete the transaction. Since this is a no cost item, you will not be charged any transaction fee. The “pay now” function will only serve to save your student’s spot on the wait list.

Policies and Procedures

REGISTRATION and PAYMENTS

1. **Registration:** To enroll a student in afterschool programs, please visit www.pay4schoolstuff.com. All registrations and payment must be completed online. Exceptions are made ONLY if a parent does not have internet access. Registration will begin on Monday, September 11th, at 10am and end on Wednesday, September 20th, at 11:45pm. A link to the registration site will be accessible on the Flint Hill PTA website (www.fhespta.org).
2. **Enrollment:** Each class has a maximum number of students. Once a class reaches its maximum capacity, it will be noted as such in our registration system. We will maintain a waitlist for any class that is full. If a space opens, you will be notified via e-mail.
3. **Class Cancellations/Modifications:** A class is subject to cancellation if it does not meet the minimum number of students required. If your student's class is cancelled, we will work with you to find another afterschool class for him/her.
4. **Emergency Contact Information:** The online registration system collects emergency contact information on each student. It is imperative that we have updated/accurate information in the event of an emergency. To save you time during the registration process, please have the following information available: emergency telephone number(s), authorized adults to pick up, local contact name and phone number (in the event your child needs to be picked up and we cannot reach you). Also, please note that if you are registering multiple students, you will be asked to enter your emergency contact information for each student.

Please complete the emergency information thoroughly and accurately!! We DO use the emergency phone numbers frequently so please make sure they are updated!

5. **Payment:** Payment will be made online by credit card. In the event credit card payment isn't possible, an e-mail should be sent to afterschool@fhespta.org to arrange for alternate payment.
6. **Registration Changes:** Any changes to registration after the online registration is completed will result in a \$10 processing fee. Please choose carefully!
7. **Withdrawals and Refunds:** Withdrawals within the first two weeks of classes will be allowed and will be refunded on a prorated basis. There will be NO refunds allowed after the second class, except for medical reasons. ALL refund requests will be subject to a \$10 processing fee.
8. **Waiver and Rules of Conduct:** After reading all of the terms and conditions, parents/guardians must agree to the Waiver and Rules of Conduct during the online registration process (prior to seeing class options). A copy is included at the end of this booklet.
9. **Financial Assistance:** PTA funding is available to families that need assistance. If you need financial assistance, please contact afterschool@fhespta.org.

School Closings and Inclement Weather Policy

1. **Schools Closings & Weather Policy:** There are no afterschool classes on holidays, teacher workdays, or any early release/dismissal days when school closes. The Afterschool Program will follow Fairfax County guidelines for school closings in the event of inclement weather. Parents will be notified **via email** if school is closing early due to unexpected events or weather. We will attempt to make up classes that are cancelled due to weather or other unforeseen issues but cannot guarantee a make-up class. We will notify you via email with any additional dates or changes to your class.
2. **Outdoor Classes & Weather:** Every effort is made to hold classes, even in inclement weather. We have worked with the school to develop a plan to move most outdoor classes inside in the event of bad weather. Please DO NOT assume an outdoor class is cancelled; please wait for email confirmation of a cancellation. If an outdoor class is cancelled due to inclement weather, parents will be notified **via email** and announcements will be made on the school PA system. On days with inclement weather forecasted, please remind your student to listen to school announcements. **If school closes early due to weather, then students should go directly home – there will be no after school classes.**
3. **Missed Classes:** Every effort will be made to reschedule missed classes due to unexpected school closure, inclement weather or instructor issues. If a class cannot be rescheduled, we will not be able to issue refunds for missed classes. If the rescheduled class does not align with your student's schedule, we will not be able to issue a refund. **There will be no refunds issued for individual class absences.**

Afterschool Class Expectations

1. **Behavior:** During the registration process, you agreed to the Waiver and Rules of Conduct that can be found at the end of this document. Please review the Rules of Conduct with your student. Afterschool programs are subject to the same behavioral guidelines as a normal school day under the FCPS Student's Rights and Responsibilities.

Disruptive behavior during class that affects the experiences of fellow participants will not be tolerated. The first offense will result in a warning, and the second offense will result in dismissal from the program without refund. If behavior continues to be a problem, participation in future afterschool programs during the same school year may be revoked at the discretion of the Program Committee and the PTA President.

If you or your student has any issues during their afterschool class, please speak directly to your afterschool class instructor and/or send an e-mail to afterschool@fhespta.org. Communicating through your classroom teacher may prolong the Afterschool Program's ability to deal with any issues.

2. **Medical Care and Treatment:** Please be aware that there are NO medical personnel on-site or anyone with access to the FHES clinic during afterschool programs. Every effort will be made to reach a parent or emergency contact in the event of an emergency.

In the FHES PTA Afterschool Program Waiver, you agreed to the following:

"The undersigned, on behalf of Participant, understands that there are no medical personnel on-site or with access to the FHES clinic during after school programs. In the event that I cannot be reached to make arrangements for emergency medical attention, I authorize the Program Coordinator or other adult present to seek immediate medical care at any facility that this person

deems suitable. I further give my consent for any and all emergency medical treatment when child/children are in this individual's care."

3. **Parent Notifications:** Registration confirmations, waitlist notifications, and other class announcements (including class cancellations) will be communicated via email. **Please make sure that your email address is correct and is checked regularly.** If you do not have an email address, please provide the primary phone number to be contacted via text or voicemail. Every attempt will be made to send reminders of regularly scheduled start and end dates as well as blackout dates. We suggest that you don't rely on these reminders and that you put all relevant dates on your calendar before the start of the session. *Please remember that this committee is run by volunteers.*

Attendance Procedures

1. **Dismissal from Classroom TO Afterschool Class:** All afterschool students will be dismissed to the cafeteria at the end of the school day. They will be met by their instructor(s) in the cafeteria for attendance and will be escorted to their afterschool location by the instructor(s). If your child goes to SACC, please have him/her check in with SACC first and then report to the cafeteria.
2. **Classroom Teacher Involvement:** Your student's teacher will receive a list of students in his/her class enrolled in afterschool classes. However, it is the parent's and student's responsibility to be aware of his/her daily schedule. Please send a note to your student's classroom teacher on the first day of each new class indicating that your student is participating in an afterschool class. Please bring any forms or other communication relating to afterschool classes to the main office and place in the PTA box, or send an email directly to the Program at afterschool@fhespta.org
3. **SACC Students:** SACC will receive a list of students enrolled in both SACC and afterschool classes. Students enrolled in SACC should first check in with the SACC staff before proceeding to the cafeteria for afterschool check-in. A SACC staff member will pick your student up at his/her class location and escort him/her back to SACC for the remainder of the day. Please notify SACC of any afterschool classes that your student will be participating in.
4. **Attendance Monitor:** The Afterschool committee includes an Attendance Monitor who is responsible for collecting attendance and notifying parents if students do not come to class and are not otherwise accounted for (e.g absent from school that day or e-mail received at afterschool@fhespta.org). **PLEASE make sure that your emergency numbers are accurate and phones are answered in the event that the attendance monitor is trying to contact you. She is doing so because your child is not in their afterschool class and she is trying to determine your child's location.**
5. **Absence Notification:** If your student will be absent from an afterschool class, please email afterschool@fhespta.org by 12:00pm on the day of the class. Notifying the committee of absences will assist the Attendance Monitor in ensuring the safety of all children enrolled in the program.
6. **Snacks:** During Attendance, your student may eat a snack from home. **Snacks MUST adhere to the same guidelines as those in the classroom – they must be peanut-free, nut-free, etc.** Afterschool students will only be allowed to eat during the Attendance period. Once their afterschool class starts, your student will not be allowed to eat their snack.

Pick-Up Procedures – TO Afterschool Classes

- Pick-up FROM Afterschool Class:** Most importantly, please pick your child up **ON TIME!** Most of the instructors work multiple jobs and have somewhere else to go following class. Please be respectful of their time. **For their safety, students will not be allowed to leave the school unattended to meet a parent/guardian in the parking lot or walk/bike home.** A parent/guardian/authorized adult must sign each child out after class. If a parent is repeatedly late to pick up a student, students may be excused from the program and/or incur fees payable to the instructor.
- Pick-up Locations for Afterschool Classes:** For safety purposes, the main doors (at Entrance 1) will be locked at all times. Therefore, we have designated the following areas for dismissal of afterschool classes:
 - Cafeteria* –Door 3 (all classes located in the cafeteria)
 - Art Room* –Door 10 (across from the art room – both KidArt classes)
 - Field* – Outdoors (either the track or the field behind the basketball courts). In the case of inclement weather and the class is brought indoors, go to the *gym*.
 - Gym* –Door 9 (gym door closest to the parking lot – all gym classes)
 - Main Lobby* – Door 1 (all classes that meet in classrooms, the music room, or the stage)

In ALL cases, please plan on picking up your student(s) approximately 5 minutes after their class ends to allow them time to arrive at their pick-up location (e.g. an afterschool class located in the gym that is scheduled to end at 4:45pm will arrive in the main lobby at approximately 4:50pm). We want to give all of our classes their full instruction time.
- Early pick-up from Afterschool Classes:** We understand that there may be times you have to pick your student(s) up early from their afterschool class. When this occurs, please send an e-mail to afterschool@fhespta.org by 12 noon on the day of class so that we may inform the instructor and coordinate the early pick-up.

Flint Hill Elementary School After School Programs Rules of Conduct & Waiver

Submitting your full name when asked on the online form is your acknowledgement that you have read and agreed to adhere to the FHES Rules of Conduct & Waiver

Students will:

- Recognize that participation in FHES afterschool programs is a privilege and not a right.
- Adhere to the general policies in this booklet, which can also be found on the FHES PTA website.
- Report to the cafeteria (or the SACC room, if applicable) at the conclusion of the school day for attendance.
- Stay with assigned group at all times and inform instructor before leaving the class area at the conclusion of class.
- Respect others in what they say and do.
- Listen to program instructors and follow directions.
- Use appropriate language at all times.
- Keep hands to themselves and maintain self-control. This includes, but is not limited to, getting in another students' personal space, excessive talking, talking over the teacher, distracting other students, and touching another student in any way.
- Take care of their own belongings
- Use equipment and supplies in a safe and appropriate manner and only after being instructed to do so by the class instructor.
- Respect school property and not cause destruction of property. This includes, but is not limited to, drawing on tables, rummaging through desks, breaking supplies, moving classroom supplies, and leaving trash behind.
- Respect instructors and treat them like classroom teachers.
- Immediately report any teasing and/or bullying to their parents and class instructors. Teasing and bullying are grounds for immediate enrollment termination.
- Play safe and have fun!

Parents will:

- Recognize that the After School Programs is a *volunteer-run* program and that their student(s)' participation is a privilege and not a right.
- Adhere to the general policies in this booklet, which can also be found on the FHES PTA website.
- Complete and submit appropriate paperwork for registration.
- Update emergency contact information as needed.
- Be on time to pick up children. The afterschool program does not offer extended hours. Students will not be permitted to leave the program area without an authorized adult or walk/bike home by themselves.
- Assist instructors in resolving behavior issues.
- Contact the committee chair when issues arise.
- Be respectful towards other students and afterschool volunteers.

Grounds for Immediate Dismissal (no refund given) include:

- Bringing a weapon to class.
- Intentionally harming or causing injury to self or others.
- Vandalizing the property of FHES, that of afterschool instructors, or that of another student.
- Stealing items from FHES, its afterschool instructors, or fellow students.
- Displaying inappropriate behavior that is outside the Rules of Conduct after being warned.

PARTICIPANT WAIVER & RELEASE (“RELEASE”)

Whereas, the Flint Hill Elementary School PTA, (“FHES PTA”) as a service to its members and students, provides various after school activities for the students at Flint Hill Elementary School (FHES):

1. The undersigned represents and warrants that he or she has the requisite legal authority and capacity to execute this Release on behalf of Participant.
2. The undersigned, on behalf of Participant, hereby knowingly and freely assumes all risks both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the Releasees or others, and assumes full responsibility for Participant’s participation.
3. The undersigned, on behalf of Participant, hereby represents that the participant has no medical or other conditions that would create any risk to the Participant in performing the tasks relating to the Programs, including sports activities, the performance of certain dance and aerobic exercise and movements.
4. The undersigned hereby acknowledges and understands that Participant must obey all instructions and rules from Program staff regarding participation.
5. The undersigned, as parent/guardian with legal responsibility for the Participant, does hereby release, indemnify, and hold harmless the FHES PTA, including its officers, agents, members and volunteers; Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS), and FHES, including their officers, board members, agents and employees; and any person or persons in charge of running the Program (the Program coordinators), the Program Vendors, their respective affiliates, successors and assigns and the officers, directors, employees and agents of such parties and their affiliates, and other participants (the “Releasees”) from any and all claims, demands, suits, costs (including attorneys’ fees and litigation costs) and charges, in connection with or arising out of the provided Program, with respect to any and all injury, disability, death or loss or damage to person or property incident to Participant’s involvement or participation in the Program, whether arising from the negligence of the Releasees or otherwise, to the fullest extent permitted by law. I understand that this Release includes any claims based on negligence, action, or inaction of the FHES PTA, FHES, and the program coordinators and volunteers.

The undersigned, on behalf of Participant, understands that there are no medical personnel on-site or with access to the FHES clinic during after school programs.

In the event that I cannot be reached to make arrangements for emergency medical attention, I authorize the Program coordinator or other adult present to seek immediate medical care at any facility that this person deems suitable. I further give my consent for any and all emergency medical treatment when the child/children are in this individual’s care.

This is a knowing and voluntary relinquishment of any rights and claims the undersigned, his/her spouse (if applicable) or anyone else may have on behalf of the Participant, and the undersigned does hereby acknowledge that such minor would not be allowed to participate in the Program in the absence of receipt of this Release.

I have read this Release and further agree that no oral representations, statements or inducements apart from the foregoing Waiver and Consent have been made.
